BACKGROUND

Contemporary management of patients with colorectal liver metastases remain controversial.

The Consensus Conference focuses on optimizing diagnosis, multidisciplinary management, and surgical strategies for colorectal liver metastases with the aim of improving patient outcomes worldwide.

PREPARATORY WORK

Made by:

- The Local Organizing Committee and the Scientific Program Committee defining the topics and questions
- A group of literature review of 10 members
- A group of 40 international faculty experts divided in panels of 4 to 5 faculty in charge of working on scientific data and draft recommendations

CONSENSUS: DANISH-ZURICH MODEL

In this model, an international and independent Jury chaired by Prof. Gregory J. Gores (Rochester, USA) includes 10 to 12 members, non-HPB surgeons and non-surgeons.

The Jury is only responsible for the final statements and recommendations.

THE CONFERENCE

For 2.5 days, this conference, open to public, will include presentation of the work from experts who will answer the questions from the Jury and audience.

At the end of the conference, the Jury meets behind closed doors to define its recommendations as well as their level of evidence.

PUBLICATION

After the conference, a manuscript reporting the methodology and the recommendations of the Jury will be published in a renowned scientific journal.
